Pastor's Perspective

I'm writing this Pastor's article in place of Art, as his mother and our church member, Helen Suggs, passed away. Our sympathy certainly is with Art, Tracy and the whole family. What a delightful, sweet woman! Her presence certainly will be missed here. At this time of year, I can't help but feel very thankful for having known a good woman like Helen.

During the holidays, we are to be thankful, as we know. This time starts with All Saint's Day, the day following All Hallowed Eve, or Halloween. On this day at church we remember and thank God for all our loved ones who've gone on before us. Then comes Thanksgiving, our national time of thankfulness, centered on the dining room table— laden full with food— and surrounded by family and friends.

And then, of course, comes the huge annual celebration of Christmas, a time where we also give thanks to God for the gifts we receive and give in our lives, and for the divinity in which we live, for all our blessings. We are to give thanks, and yet...in this busy, busy time of year, we sometimes don't feel very thankful.

I preached at the Interfaith Thanksgiving Service at St. Patrick's Roman Catholic Church on the Monday before Thanksgiving, and my theme was thankfulness, based on a passage from Deuteronomy 26, which I quote in part,

"You shall take some of the first fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name...A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down to Egypt...then you, together with the Levites, and the aliens who reside among you, shall celebrate with all the bounty that the Lord your God has given to you and to your house."

Here the people are commanded to give thanks for the bounty of the harvest. In a way we have to be commanded to say thanks, too. Our parents probably all taught us to say "thank you" upon receiving a gift, they reminded us to write that thank you note, and they taught us those other golden words, too--like "please." We learned, and then our hearts caught up, and now we can give our thanks with all our heart.

That is my holiday wish for us all this year—to be truly thankful and grateful for today, and hopeful for tomorrow. God bless this Christmas and always.

Board of Trustees Minutes, November 19, 2014

Old business:

- New lease agreement to be signed by representatives of all people/groups who rent the building. Still being worked out. Will be ready next month.
- Board is working on generating a list of everyone who uses the church. The agreement will contain a "Hold Harmless" clause.
- Electronic transfers of monies between accounts is being set up. The Bookkeeper will have the ability to look at these transfers, but not instigate them.

New business:

- A financial representative will be asked to come to the December meeting to speak to the Trustees.
- We proceed with background checks of all staff, volunteer or paid, who interface in any way with children.
 Recommended by our insurance advisors. Discussion followed. Amendment to motion: it will include only paid staff and regular volunteers and Trustees and coordinated by the Personnel Committee.
- Amended motion: We will conduct background checks on all paid staff, regular volunteers and Trustees beginning with 2015 staff.



Church Council Report- Bernie highlighted several things from that meeting (details found in their minutes) noting that the following projects are ongoing: Multimedia upgrade for the Sanctuary, Organ repair and its funding, the Advent Angel Cards, Thanksgiving Baskets (30), and the Stewardship Mailing. Thank you to Deb Miller, Dorothy Gardner, and Tom Bucker for being the Stewardship speakers this year.

Music-Thank you to Maureen Helms for her leadership of Joyful Noise, which for the first time in many years featured Rob and Sean Hollander on guitar and drum, and Dubbie and David Agard on violin. Thank you to all...beautiful music!

New Business- The Deacons will recommend to the congregation at the Annual Meeting that wine be offered in addition to grape juice for communion. Thank you to Bernie Lewis and Elizabeth Neill for the creation of "sacred sacks" that will protect our new Intinction Communion Ware made by Irene Lawson.

November started with the creation of shields and a focus on God being our strength that through him and with him we can do all things, followed by lessons on the theme of being thankful and what it means to give from the heart of God.
